Voting in 2020

- Vote by mail starting October 5th
 - If you do not receive your ballot in the mail by October 12, contact county elections office: https://tiny.cc/electionsoffice
- Voting in person will still occur on Election Day, and earlier for counties participating in Voter's Choice Act
- Persons eligible to vote in CA must meet following criteria
 - US Citizen
 - CA Resident
 - Reside in the state for 6 months out of the year
 - Have resided in state for 9 months
 - 18 years or older





Make Sure You are Registered Correctly!

- Online Voter registration deadline: Monday, October 19
 - Ensures you are on the voter roll at your polling location
 - Allows you to still be able to vote by mail
- CA voting in-person on Election Day
 - For same day voter registration, conditional ballot issued vote is counted after voter information is verified
- Check with your county to make sure your address is correct in order to receive your ballot as all ballots are being mailed out: https://tiny.cc/electionsoffice
- Check with your county for more information on registering to vote after the ASIAN AMERICANS October 19 deadline

When Can You Vote in Person?

- Polls open on Election Day, November 3, 2020 from 7 am to 8 pm
- Location of polling place is printed on the back page of the County Voter
 Information Guide that will be mailed to you by your county elections office

 - Go to any vote center in your county
 - Language Resources
 - Accessibility







Why Vote in Person?

- Overall Best Practice: <u>Vote Early either way</u>
- Voting in person is a alternative option.
 - Accessibility: Poll workers can assist you with your ballot if you have questions
 - You can get another ballot if you make a mistake on your own
 - Plan ahead! Do not wait until November 3.
 - Reach out to us if you need help making a voting plan - whether to vote in person or by mail
- Review voting by mail by viewing our last webinar/slides at bit.ly/caircavote
 - Mail-in ballots can be provided in different languages - go to https://voterstatus.sos.ca.gov/
 - Recommendation: Mail your ballot in two weeks before November 3









Safety and Security



- Even during a public health crisis, our democracy can and must go on," Secretary of State Alex Padilla
- Be proactive and vote as early and safely as possible
- Observe social distancing
- Bring PPE just in case but poll stations should have enough





Know Your Rights: Voting in Person

- **Timing:** Polls will be open from 7am to 8pm on Election Day. As long as you are in line by 8pm, you will be able to cast your vote.
- If You Need Time Off Work: California law allows workers to take time off work, with pay, to cast their ballot if they do not have enough time outside of working hours to go. You need to give notice to your employer.
- **Help with Voting:** California law allows you to bring up to two people to help you vote in person, as long as they do not represent your employer or your union. Bring a family member or friend.





Know Your Rights: Voting in Person

- **ID:** You should not be asked for ID when you go to vote, unless it is your first time voting and you did not provide ID verification when you registered to vote.
- Wrong Polling Place or Other Problem with Registration: Don't give up! If
 there is an issue with your registration, you can ask to use same-day voter
 registration to re-register and vote or ask for a provisional ballot, which is a
 ballot that will be counted after Election Day if elections officials confirm your
 eligibility.
