	Marriage certificate; Proof of termination of all previous marriages (if applicable);  two passport-style photos of petitioner and beneficiary with a white to off-white background; Form I-130A, Supplemental Information for Spouse Beneficiary; and  Evidence of bona fide marriage, which includes one or more of the following:  Documentation showing joint ownership or property  A lease showing joint tenancy of a common residence  Documentation showing co-mingling of financial resources  Birth certificate of any children born to you, petitioner, and your spouse together  Affidavits sworn to or affirmed by third parties having bona fide marriage  Any other relevant documentation to establish that there is a marriage	
Child –	if the petitioner is the <b>mother</b> – birth certificate showing petitioner's name; or if the petitioner is the <b>father</b> – birth certificate showing both parents' name and a marriage certificate; or if petitioner is the <b>father and child is born out of wedlock</b> – Submit evidence that you and the mother were married while the child was under 18 years of age, <u>or</u> submit evidence that the child was legitimated under the law of the child's residence or domicile, or under the law of your residence or domicile, before the child reached 18 years of age. If your child was not legitimated before reaching 18 years of age, you must file your petition with copies of evidence that a bona	



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fide parent-child relationship existed between you and the child before the child reached 21 years of age. This may include evidence that you lived with the child, supported him or her, or otherwise showed continuing parental interest in the child's welfare
